ASSISTANT/ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP

Job Summary: The Department of Educational Leadership is searching for a tenure-track faculty position at the rank of assistant or associate professor. Instructional responsibilities for this position would be based on candidate expertise and interest and include teaching graduate level courses in administrator preparation programs, the Ph.D. in Learning, Leadership, and Education Policy, and/or the Ed.D. in Educational Leadership.

Qualifications:

Minimum Qualifications: Candidates should have a terminal degree in educational administration, leadership, or a related field. In the event the successful candidate does not complete their terminal degree by the date of hire, that candidate would be hired in the position of Instructor. We seek scholars committed to leadership and learning and the application of theories in leadership and learning to a variety of settings; and who have experience with core issues related to K-16 leadership, organizational and adult learning, and education policies and systems. Scholars should have an established record or promise of research and scholarship in one or more of the specific areas supported by our department such as: leadership development, organizational learning and development, educational policy and reform, educator evaluation and assessment, leadership of diverse and multicultural organizations, human resource development, and public administration. Candidates should have demonstrated success collaborating with other faculty members on research projects and/or program development. Strong interpersonal skills and teaching abilities are expected.

Preferred Qualifications: We are particularly interested in scholars who embrace the goals of educational equity and access in their work and who have experience working with diverse populations; experience successfully leading or working in K-12 educational organizations; successful grant productivity or the projected abilities to obtain external funding; and the ability and willingness to collaborate with other faculty.

Appointment Terms: Salary and rank will be commensurate with experience and degree. ABD candidates appointed at the rank of Instructor will be eligible for a promotion to Assistant Professor once the degree is completed.
